We made a little money, but expenses are still coming in. We had about \$1500 in damages. Don Baker said that we need incident reports on track damage. We will report everything over the course of the weekend as one incident since there is a \$1000 deductible per incident. Don says that we submit our report to K&K, and K&K submits to SCCA. Gene said that the new form says to send the report to both. PIRC is still putting the bill together. Jeff said that including the Great Lakes group we had 163 entries.

OLD BUSINESS:

Paula said that we had 35 STC volunteer workers at the SuperTour, and put \$1098 in the worker fund. We did no handouts because of Covid restrictions and because each worker got a gaiter. She proposed giving each a polo shirt through Roger Friday. We have a \$500 budget for that. So far there are 82 registered through MotorsportsReg. ***A motion (Mike/Don) to let Chris Bill and Paula see what Roger Friday can do in shirts for STC volunteers for no more than \$1100 passed 13-1-0.***

Paula reported that Deanna and Eric were very pleased with the facility. We could be on the calendar for a SuperTour next year.

Miche went around the paddock doing registration, and the drivers loved it. Radio communications was also very good.

Bob Albert reported that everyone was happy with how the schedule ran. He received some thank you calls and no complaints.

NEW BUSINESS:

Gene stated that there is a need to break even if we have a banquet. If we can't, we shouldn't have one. Everyone agreed. AJ asked what we would do about the annual awards. Suggestions included a big Zoom meeting, or just mailing them out. Kelsey says there would not be a problem with late reservations at Grandview, so we decided to defer a decision until November.

NeOH Region is returning "The Pumpkin" (under another name) to Nelson Ledges on Halloween weekend, October 31/November 1. They are looking for volunteers. There are two remaining Track Night In America events, 9/22 at Nelson Ledges and 9/29 at PittRace.
